# **ERN Meetings**

# **Patient Groups Meeting**

#### Barcelona, 9 December 2018

European Patient Advocacy Groups (ePAGs) active in ERN GUARD-Heart had a face-to-face meeting in Barcelona on Sunday 9 December 2018. ePAGs represented at the meeting were ARVC-Selbsthilfe (Germany), Cardiac Risk in the Young (UK), European Congenital Heart Disease Organisation, Hart4Onderzoek & Harteraad (the Netherlands). Síndromes Arrítmicos relacionados con la Muerte Súbita (Spain), and Hjärtebarn (Sweden) (see ERN website for details on ePAGs). The meeting was made possible by EURORDIS. At the meeting, ePAG members discussed several topics, including their needs and expectations, tasks and responsibilities, organisation & structure of the Patient Advocacy Board of ERN GUARD-Heart, and patient journeys. The Patient Advocacy Board of the ERN GUARD-Heart aims to include at least one ePAG from each EU member state with a full HCP member in the ERN, and to have a patient representative for each rare disease covered by the ERN.

The goal of patient journeys will be to map out the journeys for rare cardiac diseases represented by the ePAGs. In other words, a patient journey will provide an overview of the sequence of care steps that a patient with a rare cardiac diseases follows from the point of entry in to the healthcare system until the end of the care process. ePAGs in the ERN GUARD-Heart will produce such patient journeys for the diseases they represent. Patients journeys will then be published on the ERN GUARD-Heart website as educational materials for the patient community. They will also serve as tools for ePAGS to engage with clinicians to highlight the needs of patients with specific rare cardiac diseases.

# European Cardiac Arrhythmia Genetics (ECGen) Group of EHRA

#### London, 23 December 2018

As part of furthering the work of the electrical disease theme in ERN Guard-Heart, the European Heart Rhythm Association (EHRA) board was approached about establishing a professional group. multidisciplinary sub-group EHRA, with an interest in arrhythmia syndromes & genetics of arrhythmia. This was met with great interest as EHRA would like to support and be a natural home for the field. The EHRA board agreed to a proposal to address training, education, guidelines and research opportunities and will provide a small budget to facilitate group and/or committee meetings. Hein Heidbuchel (president of EHRA) has already asked for representation in four committees and the following representation has been proposed: Elijah Behr (Board), Arthur Wilde (Guidelines), Iacob Tfelt-Hansen (Education), Pier Lambiase (Programme), and Vincent Probst (EHRA board representative to ECGen).

We would like to gather a group of interested parties, as representative of the ERN, the field and different nations as possible, to kick-off the formation of the ECGen group at the next EHRA congress in Lisbon. Unfortunately, this will be limited in size as the available meeting room only has space for 20 people. It is booked on Sunday 17 March (15:45 to 17:30). The aim will be to start fleshing out how to develop the group, how to establish a future committee and identify volunteers.

While we have based the group's mission on the ERN's objectives, these are universal aspirations and colleagues outside the ERN are included. **The only requirement is membership of EHRA**. We look forward to hearing from you and whether you can attend to support what we hope will be an exciting new opportunity.

# ERN Monitoring System to assess ERN performance go-live in January 2019

#### Brussels, 14 December 2018

The1<sup>st</sup> phase of the ERN Monitoring System (with 18 quality indicators) to assess the performance of ERNs has been approved by ERN coordinators, the European Commission and Board of Member States at the 4<sup>th</sup> ERN Coordinators Conference in September 2018. The final version of the 18 quality indicators have been circulated among the members of ERN GUARD-Heart and are available upon request. The IT system to support & collect the information related with the 18 indicators developed by the European Commission is about to go live in **January 2019**.

The collection of data on the 18 indicators will be organised in a two-step approach. From <u>January to the end of February 2019</u>, ERNs are asked to collect the data corresponding to years 2017 and 2018. From <u>April 2019 ERNs</u> will start to collect the information corresponding to the 1 quartile of 2019. Information should be collected at least every 3 months although it would be possible to upload the information monthly. ♥

There is a new set of products i.e., video clip, flyer, poster) which are specifically targeted to patients and their doctors. The video clip and the flyer are publicly available on the ERN webpage. The other linguistic versions will be ready by end January/beginning of February 2019.





# Activity of the ERN GUARD-Heart members in the CPMS

#### Amsterdam, 24 January 2019

The Clinical Patient Management System (CPMS) is a EUprovided secure online consultation tool for 2<sup>nd</sup> opinion service in ERNs. Using CPMS, experts can discuss their patients within the ERNs, and can be invited to provide their 2<sup>nd</sup> opinion advice. Each participating centre within the ERN GUARD-Heart will be assessed by the European Commission (EC) with regard to its activities within the CPMS. In fact, the activity of each ERN centre within the CPMS is a quality indicator used by the ERN Monitoring System of the EC (see page 4 of this Newsletter) to assess the performance of the ERN in general and of each HCP in the ERN in particular. It is of extreme importance that all ERN GUARD-Heart members have an CPMS account and use the CPMS for patient consultation. So far, 11 of the 24 ERN GUARD-Heart member centres have entered at least one patient in the CPMS. All ERN members can contact the CPMS Helpdesk of the ERN for any assistance regarding the use of CPMS. •
