ERN GUARD-Heart Webinars

Amsterdam, 29 September 2022

Last summer, ERN GUARD-Heart started a series of Webinars for healthcare professionals. All interested (multidisciplinary) colleagues from full ERN member and Affiliated Partner hospitals are invited to register for general information and announcements about these webinars.*

The first two Webinars were held and the number of attendees increases, although the number of participants lacks behind the number of subscriptions. Evaluation will take place to try to improve the direct connected number of participants. The webinars are recorded and will be available via the ERN website. During each Webinar 1 or 2 patients will be discussed by anyone who wants to discuss a case and will be evaluated by 1 or 2 ERN expert(s). Thereafter all participants will be encouraged to ask questions and to discuss the cases. Each webinar will cover one specific thematic area, and will take no more than 45 minutes. Currently, about 225 participants registered already. For each webinar, a flyer will be send to the webinar-email-list with the topic, title, and name of the speaker and a registration link. A separate registration per webinar is needed. Thereafter the link to the meeting will be shared.
